<p>Note: There are certain key populations that are not yet part of the system outlined above, including Native Tribal members, military personnel, children, and pregnant women. We anticipate military personnel will work directly with the federal government. Tribal consultations and confers are ongoing with our Native Tribes and Urban Indian Health program regarding their preferred methods of vaccine allocation and distribution. Children and pregnant women are not included in this preliminary phased approach as the current vaccine trials exclude children and pregnant women. We anticipate some guidance from the federal government about the safety and efficacy in these important populations at the time of an emergency use authorization or full approval and plan to incorporate children and pregnant women, if appropriate, at the time of actual implementation.</p>
